Brief Description of Module Content	This is a programming course with a difference. The seminar will start by covering the importance of programming and what the requirements are contractually for NZS3910 and NEC3. With this in mind the focus will be on how to compile a programme which at the same time enables the effective commercial management of a project. Effective commercial management helps to: • objectively assess the cost impact of change, • avoid delays, • avoid abortive work, • avoid disputes, • mitigate cost escalations, • increase effective communication and collaboration across the supply chain, and • increase the chances of delivering a successful project. The course is aimed at contractors, consultants and clients. Whilst a programme is usually produced by the contractor or consultant, clients need to be aware of what ought to be produced and can enhance their programming requirements in their requirements.
