


Name	Why	Example
Tyco Supplier of Fire Equipment to Wormald	 Resisted providing ingredient/material information Low enthusiasm for LBC and green philosophy – One internal email referred to LBC as 'Green bullshit' Many products did not comply Many products needed redesign solutions to be applied by subcontracts 	 The sheathing of fire wiring did not comply. Arrow enforced a change of product to ensure no cadmium with the use of clear sheathing.
HR Cement	 Considered product to be too sensitive Would not disclose ingredients 	•
Hymes – Precast concrete	 Waiotahi preferred provider. Said materials complied, required significant investigation at cost of project to prove product. Risk to project 	 Used, but very slow on providing compliant documentation
Fire Sense – Fire cabling	 Needed to sign confidentiality agreement Not forthcoming with info Fire cabling went in by Wormald (who did not report) 	 Did not meet LBC requirements. required an exemption



Noise mitigation and atea mounds


Ceremonial spaces: atea, open space for ahurei





