Did you know ...

50%

of falls from height are from less than three metres

and most of these falls are from ladders and single-storey roofs















Did you know ...

\$24 million

is the estimated annual cost of falls from height in the construction industry















Falls from height are preventable

- More injuries happen on residential building sites than any other construction workplace
- Builders, roofers, electrical workers, painters, and decorators are the most likely to fall at work
- Employers and contractors with staff working at height must actively manage this significant hazard
- Everyone is responsible for preventing falls







What is the Department doing

a three year campaign to reduce the number of falls from height in construction

- engagement raising awareness through construction organisations, associations and councils
- education clarifying what safe looks like and providing information about best practices
- enforcement targeted and consistent across the country from July 2012

How to work safely at height

- Identify the hazard of working at height
- Select controls to manage the hazard
- Manage contractors effectively











Identify the hazard

- Physical inspections
- Task analysis
- Process analysis
- Analysis of accident investigation details







Manage the hazard

- Can work at height be avoided?
- Can a fall be prevented?
- Can equipment be used to minimise the distance and/or consequences of a fall?
- Can additional training and other measures be taken?















Select hazard controls

- Group Control Measures
 - Passive

- Personal Control Measures
 - Active















Managing contractors

- Plan and prepare for the work
- Ensure the contractor is up to the job
- Provide information and resources for contractors
- Monitor the performance of the contract















Doing nothing is not an option

From 1 July - targeted enforcement

- worksite visits
- looking for duty holders who are cutting corners
- enforcement continues until compliance improves
- infringement notices will be issued for repeated failures
