



Critical Safety Issues

- Working in marine environment
 - Deep excavations below sea bed/beach level
 - Very difficult conditions for divers
- Safety of the public
- Reduced seismic capacity and limited live load capacity of pier deck
- Unique construction methodology for NZ







What worked Well?


- Assessment of project risks during the design phase and how they could be mitigated through design changes
- A simple solution
- Contractor selection based on a detailed methodology
- Collaboration with Contractor throughout to manage Safety Risks
- Always have a plan B, C & D in place
- Allowance for inclement weather days to reduce pressure on Contractor

- Incidents = 4
- Long Term Injury = 0
- Medical TreatmentInjuries = 4
- Near Misses = 11
- Construction Cost = \$7.5m (on time and on budget)
